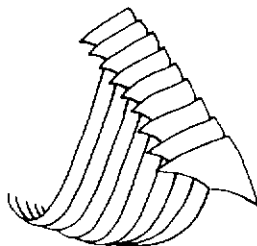

Imagine a place with constant warm weather, wind, and sunshine; a place with miles of sandy beaches and open parks, three kite shops, several world-renowned kite manufacturers – and stunt kite teams – as well as a kite club with over 300 members. That place exists... San Diego, California.

Founded just a little more than a year ago by avid flier Dan Willan, the San Diego Kite Club (SDKC) started on the kite field with only 11 members. Original members include Executive Vice President Tony Hilliard, Treasurer Ron Despojado, and Secretary Virginia Hill. After laying the groundwork, Dan was elected President and watched the club double in size, and double again. Then, the club became an AKA club affiliate this year, just before the California Open. In addition to judging at that event, the SDKC provided most of the volunteer work behind the scenes. "That was when the SDKC came into its own, and we gained another hundred members," Dan said. "It was worth all the work."

Today, the SDKC continues to grow at an unprecedented rate. The rapid growth has surprised everyone, and has not come without a few growing pains. Mailing lists are constantly being updated, and printing a high quality, 24-page newsletter is costly. But most club members say the end result has been worth it.

Besides the newsletter, a five-color cloisonné pin of the club logo is on order, and the club has stickers and badges. There have been several festivals, including the Del Mar Fair, which ran for nearly three weeks, nearly wiping out a few of the members! The SDKC has sponsored seminars with Ron Reich, the Hadzicki brothers, and Randy Tom, all of whom are club members. Other members include local teams such as Hyperkites Elite, Killer Bees, San Diego Extreme, Team Revolution and Team Top Of The Line.

The SDKC isn't just stunt kites however, single-liners are well represented in all shapes and sizes. The world's largest Delta kite, at 76 ft. wide, is owned by club member Gene Carey, and we hope to get several other entries into the record books. Fighter kite competitions are held monthly under the guidance of Victor Heredia, who made the famed Vic's Fighter kite.

The club's motto is: The Sky's The Limit – Reach For It! "Our main focus is to try to help the community get involved in the sport," said Tony Hilliard, the club's Executive Vice President. "We want to educate people. Very few outsiders know what we're doing from just watching across the field. Yet with a few minutes instruction, they can begin to fly even the trickiest stunt kite. Then they're hooked."

The SDKC Board of Directors is rounded out by Tori Cable, Events Coordinator, Adam David, Public Relations, Charlie

McClary, Archivist. Walt Thompson will be editing upcoming newsletters, and myself as Vice President.

The usual meeting place is Tecolote Shores Field, just south of the Hilton Hotel in the sprawling Mission Bay Park. Given the climate, flyers are likely to be seen there every day throughout the year. Regular meetings are held every third Saturday at 11 am, but the SDKC's busy schedule means it's a good idea to check the club calendar first. A recent addition is the club hotline – (619) 483-KITE, with updated messages on events. More raffles are also in the works. Through generous contributions from the local manufacturers and retailers, SDKC raffles are proving to be both popular and profitable for the club.

Recently, the Mission Bay Park was considering banning kiteflying, due to several complaints. But thanks to the members of SDKC (over 50 members attended the meeting at last minute's notice!), a compromise was made with the Directors of the Park.

SDKC will co-sponsor with the Freedom In Flight Project (FIFP), an organization that provides stunt kites to physical therapy programs and clinics for introduction to the physically handicapped community, the first World Open Fighter Kite Challenge Championship and Kite Expo on November 16 & 17. The event will be held at Mission Bay Park (Mariners Point) in San Diego. A perpetual trophy will be awarded and it promises to be an exciting event. 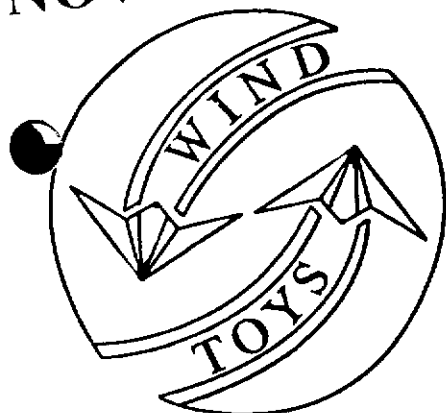

The Leading edges have been reinforced and loops for standoffs provided. (The standoffs are not included. Buy a pair, trust me). All this extra and the price is the same? Terrific!

The new Hot Wing flies the same but promises greater durability due to the protected leading edges.

Many a Hot Wing can be spotted with repair tape on the leading edge.

Nose Problems Persists

Another nasty problem with Hot Wings is not addressed by the recent fix. Due to operator error, Hot Wings often crash with amazing impact. The protective webbing on the nose of the kite is not up to such abuse. I thought Rich was the only one who could rip such a light kite, but I have seen Hot Wings at the Hilton with the same problem.

The spars rip through the nose webbing area by passing through the lighter material and exiting the nose to the side of the heavy webbing. It may be too early to speculate but I think that the webbing is too narrow to capture the thrust of the spars as they are pile driven into the ground. Fixes abound, but none works well if you insist on crashing. If mine goes I am going to try stitching a wider piece of material on the nose.

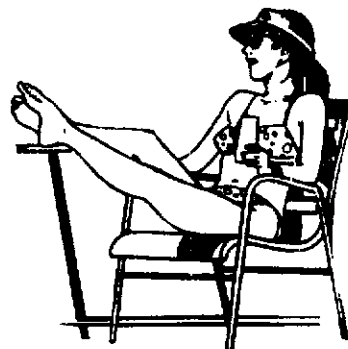

Why bring this up at all? Kiteflyers are at risk for this just as

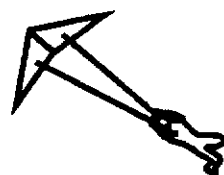

As many of you read in the previous "SkyLines Newsletter", our club pins were on order. Then the order was dropped on the day we expected them.

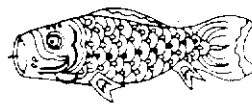
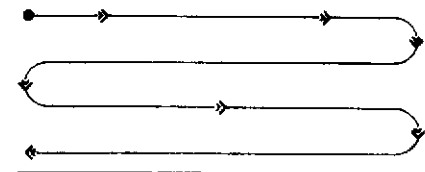
I was directed to another pin manufacturer by one of the local kite manufacturers. After sending the artwork and a deposit it looked like our beloved pins would be on their way. I explained to the sales representative how our previous order from another company was dropped due to their factory in Taiwan shutting down. She assured me that they can fulfill the order within their normal time frame, usually 8 weeks. Also, I requested from her to notify me if there was any problem at all. She definitely would stay in touch. Well, she kept her word. About 3-4 weeks later she called me and said that the shop they use overseas has shut down. Deja vu? They still can fill the order except for 2 minor detail time and money. They would have to transfer the order to a U.S. plant, naturally, it has a higher labor cost than any overseas country. Also, the order would have to start again from the beginning. Under typical business conditions I would cancel the order and find another pin company. Since they are willing to continue the order and did notified me right away I agreed to proceed with them if they can deliver the pins by the day of the Freedom in Flight event. They said they could.

Let's all keep our fingers crossed. I have been given the names of a few more pin manufacturers by fellow club members in case these don't come through.

Stay tuned for the ongoing saga of the Cloisonne pins.

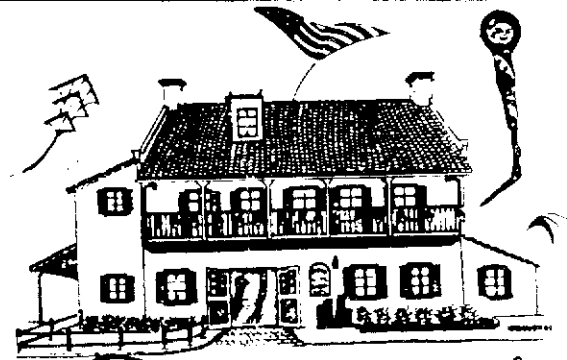
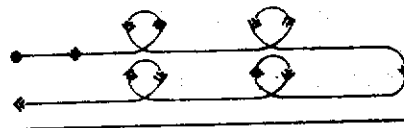

Kite lines Safety Code

When kites take your spirits soaring, don't throw your caution to the wind, which is to say, keep safety in mind. Kite lines, the quarterly journal of kiteflying, has prepared the following safety code.

The Four Nevers of Kiteflying

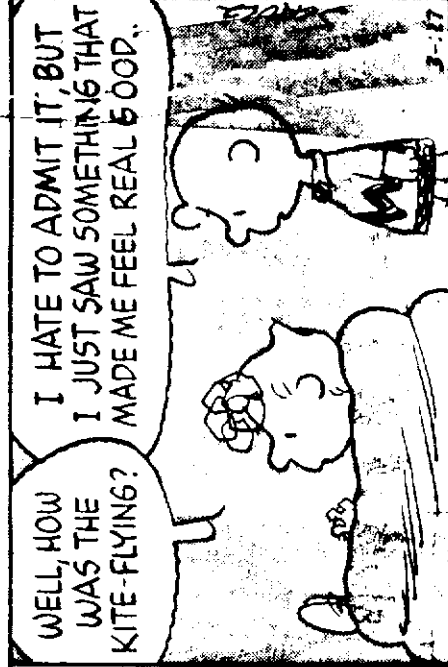
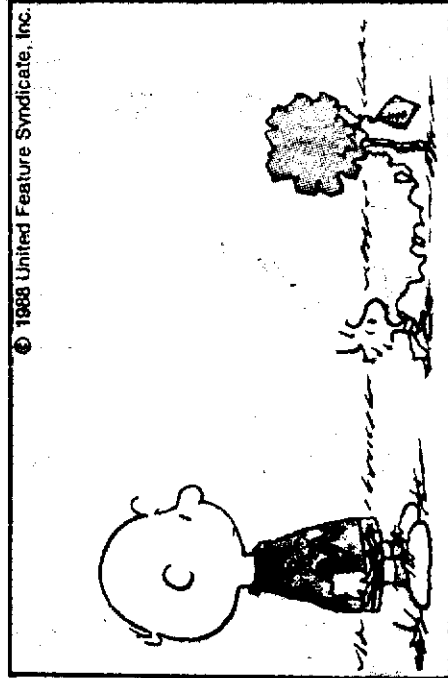
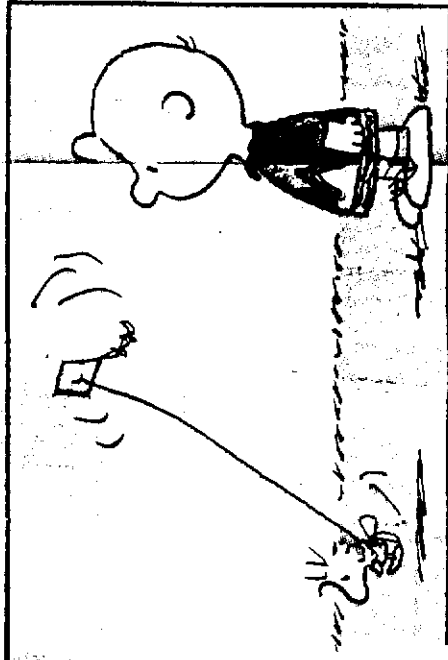
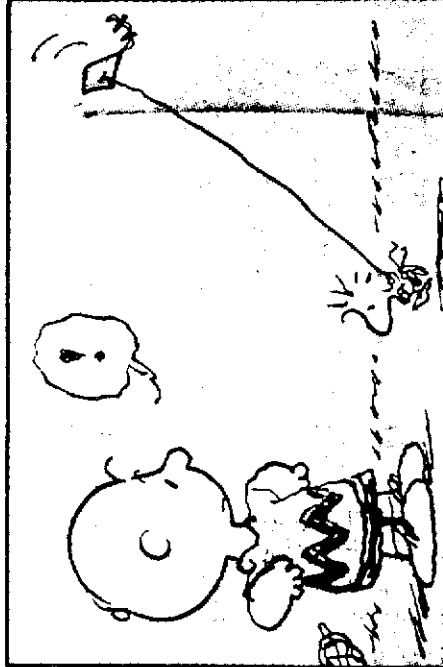
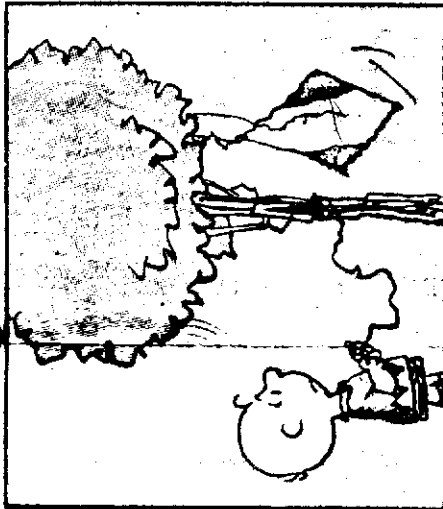
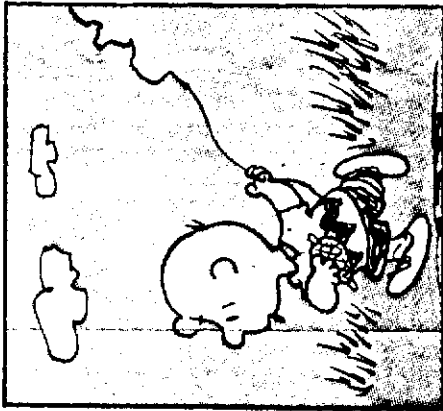
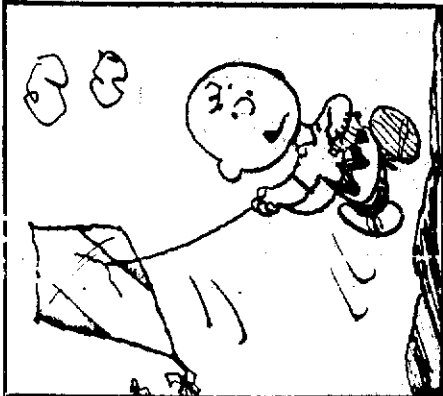
- 1 Never fly a kite in wet or stormy weather, and keep your line dry.
- 2 Never fly a kite near electric power lines, transmission towers, or antennas.
- 3 Never fly a kite with wire or anything metallic in its line.
- 4 Never fly a hard-pulling kite without wearing gloves.

Five Things to Avoid While Kiteflying

- 1 Public streets and highways - don't fly in or near or over them.
- 2 Air traffic patterns.
- 3 Bystanders in your kite's line of attack - especially when flying maneuverable kites.
- 4 Rocky, bumpy or obstacle-filled fields - they can trip you up.
- 5 Trees - but if you do lose a kite to a kite-eating tree, loosen the line and let the wand fly it out.

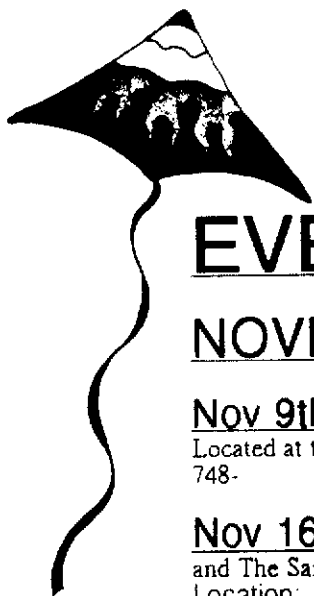



New Products Corner

Sky Roller Kite Bags

San Diego Kite Club SkyLines reporter caught up with Danny Anderson recently while flying at Mission Bay.

SDKC: Danny, how did you come up with the idea for your fantastic kite bag?

Danny A: Well, I was tired of using a ski bag for a kite bag. I was over at my Brother in Law's house when he showed me a leather chisel bag that he received as a gift. I looked at it and got an idea for a kite bag. I made my first bag out of a canvas drop cloth. I carried it around for about a year. It had splotches of paint on it and was getting real beat up. I thought about having it manufactured here locally, but nothing ever came of it. While at my sisters wedding in Oklahoma, my father saw my bag. He said that he could help develop the bag and get it on the market. (His father has a spa and hot tub cover company.) With my dad getting involved in the bag. He started to fly kites also. Dads been flying kites for about 6 months now and getting pretty good at it. He even opened a kite shop in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. It is called "Wings On Strings"

SDKC: Tell me about you Danny?


Danny A: I am married to a lovely wife, her name is Katrina. We have been married 10 years and have a child by the name of Marley.

We have lived San Diego County for the past 3 years. I like to fly Quad line kites. I also fly Duel line kites. I own a great number of both types. Including a couple of stacks, which I enjoy flying.

SDKC: Tell me about the bags themselves?

Danny A: The Sky Roller Kite Bag is made of 200 Denier nylon. It is sewn with UV resistance nylon thread. It retails from \$90.00 to \$120.00. It is carried in 8 stores across the United States. Three of the stores are in San Diego. They are Kite Country, Seaport Kite Shop, and All About Kites. The bags can be custom ordered in many colors(Black, Red, Royal Blue and Teal) and with graphics on them. These bags can be customized to be used as a sign for teams. Also an new option available is a wind break kit. It allows you to use the kite bag as a shelter against the elements. (He developed this kit while freezing at the Berkeley kite festival.) At this time we make 4 models and are introducing a new model for fighter kites. They come in long and short models and can hold 6 or 10 kites depending on the model. The bag has pockets and zippered compartments for belongings and kite stuff.

SDKC: Thank you Danny for a look at the Sky Roller Kite Bag. Lets go flying.

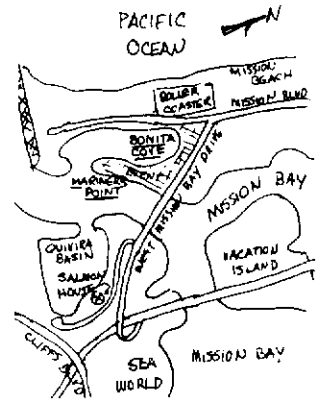

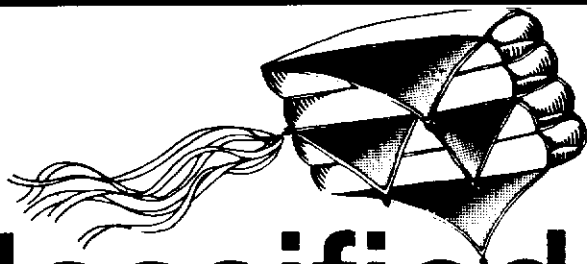
