Big Time Halloween?.... Yes!!




The Double Lozenge

The Double Lozenge Kite has proven to be not only a perfect kite for large graphics, but also a fairly stable flier as well.

Having been asked to build a birthday kite for a friend, I began searching for a suitable backdrop for a large Joker applique. The hunt was over when I saw some drawings for the double lozenge in one of my kite books. After a few modifications and lots of sewing of applique, the Joker flew on June 12 in Reading, PA with many positive comments and a very happy kite builder on the ground side of the kiteline.

With so many layers of color, an alternative method was used for the applique. I chose the layered method with the lighter colors on the back and darker colors on the front. the face was partially completed before being applied to the back, since the number of layers would have been too thick for the detail of the mouth and eyes. Some of the pieces were cut out before the next layer was applied. The entire pattern must be put on the back of the main piece so that there is a sewing guide to follow, especially when sewing the



black parts of the pattern. Standard methods are otherwise used with a zigzag stitch.

There are two ways to spar this kite. Method one, uses wooden spars, with 5/16" for the vertical and 1/4" for all horizontals. The plastic dyhedral must be drilled to 5/16" for the vertical spar which can be either one piece of two pieces with a ferrule so that the skin can be removed for repairs. Method two, uses 1/4" AFC 2400's throughout utilizing a ferrule for the vertical spar.

I sure hope you try this one out, especially if you need a kite for a large graphic and you already have a rokkaku.
