Tsunami wins World Cup V

Team Tsunami from California captured the World Cup Championship in Le Touquet France on September 9 through 11. In winning the cup, Tsunami broke Hawaii's Team High Performance's string of three consecutive World Cup Championships. High Performance was visibly absent from the competition. <u>Unconfirmed</u> reports say that High Performance has retired, though no official word has been received at press time.

The World Cup Competition is in its fifth year of existence and in all years, the trophy has gone to a team from the United States, but even more unusual, the winning team has been from either California or Hawaii.

Sky Arches

Dear SDKC folks,

About Sky Arches- I just finished a big one in June. Two test flights showed us we had to make some changes. If the spars are too light, the arch will bow and want to act like a jumprope. We had 1/4" fiberglass battens in it and changed to 3/8" fiberglass rod to stiffen it. Thankfully, I had to make pockets with velcro tab ends, so it was easy to change. The pair at the ends are about 1" wood dowels. But our arch doesn't end there.

I sewed 25' of leechline into a rolled hem on both sides and both ends, with a 6' extensions that fasten to a pair of old Flexi-foil control bars. It took heavy reinforcements at the end of the fabric to keep the fabric from ripping out the second time.

I also used nylon taffeta, not ripstop. Why waste expensive kite fabric when you can get good taffeta-flag quality- for a third the price? 'Its 45" wide, about 40" finished.

It took 3 people grabbing a bar on each end, and about a dozen side people to control it prior to lift-off. A nice team field effort!


Oh- you'll see it at the convention. I made it for Tom Ryan, & he'll need a alot of help in the field! A few hands-across-the-country would be so welcome!

This seminar gave attendeees the opportunity to learn from among the best

SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 24, 1994 THE CLUB HELD A Kite Making Seminar at the Rec Building at Robb Field, attended by 17 people, club members and others.

John Rogers was the first speaker, he started out with a short introduction to the different types of kites he likes to build and the different tools he uses. He explained how he uses each tool and where they can be purchased. One thing John admitted is that he is not a perfectionist, and that every seam doesn't have to be straight to fly. Everyone was given printed

directions on making a snake and John demonstrated how to cut the pieces and assemble them. He then went on to tell us about his big Arch, the putting together for the first time and the corrections he had to make to make it fly.

It's easy once you know how

Parafoils look very complicated, but John's lesson on how to put one together made it look a little easier than I thought at first. With a bit of practice, and possibly a lot of trial and error, anyone with some patience could put a parafoil together. By the time John finished showing us his methods on kite making, we broke for a stretch and lunch.

Diane did it again- had a great meal set up. When she said cold-cuts, we didn't expect roast beef. turkey, and ham, with all the trimmings. There was also potato salad, cole slaw, a vegetable tray with great dips, rolls and three different breads. There was plenty for everyone and I noticed several going back for refills later in the afternoon.

Spinsocks to knock your socks off

After we all relaxed for awhile it was time for more lessons in kite making. Now it was time for Virgil Dalton to show off his fine technique for making spin socks. Although John uses big tools to make Big things that fly, Virgil uses an old Solder Gun as a Hot Knife, a solder pencil for tacking, plain scissors for cutting thread etc. and inexpensive, small spools of thread for sewing. (We had a spin sock out in 25-30 Kt winds without a sewing failure).

Virgil went through the steps of making a spin sock from cutting material, marking and sewing the panels, inserting the stiffener and hooking up the bridle. When the spin sock was finished the names of the people attending the Seminar were placed in



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a hat and one was drawn by Virgil. The spin sock was won by a very happy Larry Morgan.

Apply these applique methods

The third and final speaker was Jose Sainz on the use of applique on kites. Jose brought a replica of his winner kite depicting the Aztec calendar done in applique. It was very artistic and beautiful. The workshop consisted of a history of applique in kiting, the type of tools, material and threads used, how to obtain, apply and sew a design on the kite. The sewing machine obviously is a very important tool in doing applique work. Jose listed features that one should look for in a sewing machine. He showed us a machine once owned by Randy Tom and said one of the reasons he bought it was "for the magic hopefully still inside." Jose also touched on items that judges look for in the competitive field of

applique. We took a learned to cut away the unecessary cloth to bring out the

wanted design. We were also instructed in the fine art of covering up boo-boo's by Jose. After some hands on experience by the attendees it was time to auit.

The information that we got from three different kite builders during this seminar stirred our interest so much that we want to try these techniques on our own.

We highly recommend these seminars to anyone interested in kiting. Thanks to John, Virgil and Jose.




