

WINDS FROM THE WILLOW: Part II

By the time you receive this newsletter many of the club members will have used up much of this years supply of wind. March was a great month to be a kite flyer. It began with the 51st annual Kite Festival in Ocean Beach on the first weekend of March, followed by the 24th Festival of the Kite in Redondo Beach on the 13th. (75 years of kiting right there) That same weekend Ellen and Marshall Morgan were filling the skies with their wonderful kites in Valencia for another Pardee Grand Opening. We then all gathered to catch our breath and swap tales at the March meeting. This was followed by the Belmont Sport Kite Challenge in Long Beach. The following day we all remembered Larry Mixon in the manner he would have wanted, a celebration of the kite. So what if we didn't have time to pay our bills, at least we had fun.

The San Diego Kite Club has been invited to be a MAJOR participant in Pacific Beachfest. This event, planned by the PB Town Council, is a new Fall addition and is supposed to rival the PB Street Fair held each Spring. As of now, we will have the entire coast 1/4 mile on each side of the PB Pier for our Single line kites and a Sport Kite flying area 2-300 foot square at the foot of Grand Ave., right next to the main lifeguard station, with sound system. As far as I am concerned the Sport Kite flying area is the prime spot for all activities in PB. This event could give kiting in San Diego the most exposure it has ever had. They are projecting attendance of at least 30,000 people. We have attached parts of the press release to show you a bit of the flavor of the event. As of now our club is not mentioned only

because I have not committed to the event. If we can get enough members interested I will do so immediately. I truly believe this event is the biggest and best thing for kiting to happen in San Diego since we have been members of the Club. The event will be held 10/09/99, I know that is the last day of the Nationals so those attending will not be able to make it, but everyone else, if you are from you should. Additionally, the PB Town Council aplanning to make this an annual event, so we could be set for years if we do make a good showing. Please read the news release. We will talk about it at the June Meeting.

As you can see the club has and will have activities for everyone. The board of the SDKC has and is doing its best to see that we continue to do so. At the February meeting, attendance almost doubled to about 30, which was great. Again, I would like to say, if you are a member please come join us. We are a volunteer organization and need to have help and guidance in choosing our direction. Anyone can join us at the board meeting and everyone should join us at the meetings. At the last board meeting we even discussed moving our meeting place permanently to a new location. I won't tell you where so maybe it will perk your interest enough to come join us and express your opinion. Our mission is to show the world the joys of kiting. and what better way to do it than through a show of force on the 3rd Saturday of each month.





After all, Larry had already done all the hard work to get the invitation way back at AVI. He was sooo nice to Brian there, opening doors for him, feeding him his crackers and cheese, wiping the crumbs from his chin, buttering his bread, and even leaving a brownie on his pillow at night! Linda couldn't vez well let all Larry's brown er ground work go fc naught could she? Finally she promised to come and I'm so glad we will all have another chance to see Larry's kites flying proudly. I know we'll always miss Larry, but as long as we can see those parts of him up there in the wind, he'll never truly be gone.








Good News!!

Nominations Sought For 1999-00 Club officers

In May and June we will be taking nominations for all offices. We hope to have a ballot ready to print in the June newsletter. The actual election will take place in July as usual, but this will give members who can't come to the July meeting a chance to vote.

Names will be put into nomination for specific offices. We will have a ballot box available at the meetings, or you can send in your nominations anonymously. You may nominate yourself, of course. No one will be forced to run if they don't wish to.

I think a lot of people shy away from holding an office because they think they don't have time or it will be too much work. That is why we are listing the offices here along with a brief description. You should find something here that will mesh with your talents (or someone you know). Please get involved and support your club.




President: Basically, the coordinator of coordinators. The President sets the agenda and presides over club and board meetings, is the main spokesperson for the club, writes a nifty "Presidents Message" for the newsletter.

Vice President: Assists the president and fills in for the president when he/she is unavailable. May write a nifty "Vice President's Message" for the newsletter.



Secretary: Takes the minutes of the monthly board meeting, takes care of any correspondence with other clubs, the AKA, and businesses. Usually updates the general meeting information hotline and responds to inquiries made by individuals interested in the club.







Events Coordinator: Helps make schedule for regular club meetings and plan food sales, suggests and coordinates special events such as seminars. workshops, special guests, competitions, fund raising activities, fun and games. Ideally this officer would work with a committee or team to implement these activities.

Membership Chairman: Maintains accurate, up-to-date list of members and dues status, maintains mailing list including paid members, honorary members, club exchanges and kite businesses (a computer with database program is needed), prints out labels for newsletter mailings, arranges for membership table to be set up and manned at certain events.





Equipment Manager: Stores or arranges for storage of club equipment (kites, sound system, tables, food service items), makes sure needed equipment is brought to meeting or event, arranges for repair or replacement of broken or depleted items.



Public Relations Coordinator: Club liaison with media, work with events coordinator in publicizing club events, promoting goodwill in the community, and helping with community based programs, such as schools needing members to help kids build kites.

Archivist: Keeps all the junk. No, just kidding. Collects and maintains all kite and club-related materials (newsletters, magazines, videos, letters, records, minutes of board meetings.



Board Members: Attend board meetings, play an active role in planning and implementing ideas for club activities.


