



'TWAS THE SEASON TO BE FLYING.....HO, HO, HO...MERRY CHRISTMAS AND HAPPY NEW YEAR! I HOPE EVERYONE HAD A SAFE AND ENJOYABLE HOLIDAY SEASON, AND THAT SANTA WAS GOOD TO ALL!

TO GIVE YOU A RE-CAP OF DECEMBER, THE S.D.K.C. WAS QUITE BUSY. ON DECEMBER 15TH, THE REVOLUTION KITE TEAM PRESENTED A SEMINAR FOR THE S.D.K.C. WHICH COMMENCED AT 1:00PM WITH APPROXIMATELY 25 MEMBERS IN ATTENDANCE. WINDS WERE NIL UNTIL A PRAYER TO THE WIND GOD STARTED THINGS ROLLING. IT WAS A VERY INFORMATIVE SEMINAR, WITH THE S.D.K.C. MONTHLY MEETING FOLLOWING. DURING THE MEETING A RAFFLE WAS HELD IN WHICH PRIZES INCLUDED KITE STAKES. SHIRTS, PINS, POSTERS, KITES AND MISCELLANEOUS GOODIES. HELPING TO SPONSOR THIS EVENT WITH MATERIAL **DONATIONS** INCLUDED REVOLUTION KITES, KITE COUNTRY, ALL ABOUT KITES, KITE MANIA, KITE WIZARD AND DAN RUBESH.

DURING THE SEMINAR/MEETING WE HAD A VISITOR FROM THE HIGH DESERT KITE CLUB JOIN US. WHICH IS LOCATED IN LANCASTER. CALIFORNIA. DAN HARRISON OFFERED AN INVITATION TO ALL IN ATTENDANCE, ALTHOUGH SHORT NOTICE, TO ATTEND THE HIGH DESERT KITE CLUB'S SEMINAR ON TRADITIONAL JAPANESE KITING. PRESENTED BY MAKOTO OHASHI. WHICH WAS TO BE HELD THE FOLLOWING SUNDAY, DECEMBER 12TH.

AFTER BRIEF THOUGHT, MARGIE GLOVER AND MYSELF DECIDED THAT THIS WAS AN OPPORTUNITY NOT TO BE MISSED. THE DAY OF THE SEMINAR WE LEFT SAN DIEGO AT 2:00PM, BEGINNING OUR 8-HOUR ROAD TRIP THROUGH THE HIGH DESERT ENROUTE TO LANCASTER. THAT EVENING AT 7:00PM, WE JOINED APPROXIMATELY 10 OTHERS FOR THE SEMINAR.

I WAS ASKED TO PROVIDE THE GROUP SOME INFORMATION REGARDING THE HISTORY OF THE SAN DIEGO KITE CLUB, ALONG WITH OUR FLY-IN AND MEETING LOCATION IN SAN DIEGO, AND INFORMATION REGARDING WHAT IS IN STORE IN THE WAY OF PROPOSED FUTURE CLUB EVENTS.

FOLLOWING MY INTRODUCTION, MAKOTO OHASHI BEGAN TO SPEAK ON WHAT WE WERE THERE TO HEAR: THE SUBJECT OF TRADITIONAL JAPANESE KITING NATIVE TO THE ISLANDS OF JAPAN. IT WAS A VERY INTERESTING SEMINAR, WITH MAKOTO PROVIDING AN ABUNDANCE OF INFORMATION WHICH HE SHARED WITH THE GROUP, AS WELL AS ANSWERING NUMEROUS QUESTIONS DURING THE 2 1/2 HOUR SEMINAR.

MAKOTO HAS ADDITIONALLY MADE A PRESENTATION AT THE SEASIDE DRAGON DURING THE A.K.A. CONVENTION.

MAKOTO IS 21 YEARS OLD, HERE IN THE UNITED STATES AS A STUDENT. HE BEGAN BUILDING KITES WITH A KITE MASTER AT THE AGE OF 11. BEING, BASICALLY, AN ARTIST, HE USES KITES AS HIS "CANVAS". MAKOTO RECOGNIZES APPROXIMATELY 300 OF THE KNOWN 1500 STYLES OF KITES JAPAN CURRENTLY CLAIMS.

I LEARNED THAT MAKOTO PLANNED TO BE IN THE SAN DIEGO AREA FROM DECEMBER 20TH THROUGH THE 24TH, AND INQUIRED WHETHER HE WOULD CONSIDER HOLDING ANOTHER SEMINAR FOR THE S.D.K.C. ON THURSDAY, DECEMBER 20TH. HE SAID HE WOULD BE HAPPY TO! ELATED WITH THE NEWS, THE LONG DRIVE HOME SEEMED CONSIDERABLY SHORTER!

THE FOLLOWING MONDAY, I PROCEEDED TO NOTIFY ALL CLUB MEMBERS BY PHONE OF THE UPCOMING EVENT, AND MADE ARRANGEMENTS FOR A CLASSROOM IN WHICH TO CONDUCT THE SEMINAR.

ON DECEMBER 20TH AT 7:30PM, MAKOTO OHASHI PRESENTED OUR CLUB WITH A SEMINAR ON TRADITIONAL JAPANESE KITING BEFORE *15 MEMBERS* ATTENDANCE (NOT BAD FOR 4 DAYS NOTICE!). THANKS TO ALL WHO WERE PRESENT, AND TO THOSE UNABLE TO ATTEND, YOU MISSED A GREAT SEMINAR. HOWEVER, A VIDEO WAS MADE DURING THE MEETING AND WILL BE AVAILABLE TO THOSE INTERESTED IN VIEWING IT.

ON DECEMBER 21ST, I PROVIDED A TOUR OF ALL OF THE KITE MANUFACTURERS AS WELL AS KITE SHOPS IN THE SAN DIEGO AREA TO MAKOTO, AND WE ENJOYED "RUBBING ELBOWS" WITH THOSE IN THE KITING COMMUNITY.

ON DECEMBER 22ND, TOP OF THE LINE KITES WERE INTERVIEWED BY MAKOTO ON BEHALF OF THE J.K.A. (JAPANESE KITING ASSOCIATION). A REPRINT OF THIS WILL FOLLOWAY A FUTURE NEWSLETTER ISSUE.

RON REICH HAS ADVISED ME THAT TOP OF THE LINE WILL BE PROVIDING A SKIN FROM A TOP OF THE LINE SPIN-OFF KITE AS A DOOR PRIZE TO BE GIVEN AWAY DURING THEIR SEMINAR ON JANUARY 19TH.

ADDITIONALLY, TOP OF THE LINE'S DON TABOR WILL BE PROVIDING TWO MORE SKINS TO BE RAFFLED OFF AS DOOR PRIZES AT SOME POINT DURING FUTURE CLUB MEETINGS, INCLUDING A TEAM CHEVRON AS WELL AS THE POSSIBILITY OF A NEW NORTH SHORE RADICAL SKIN.

REVOLUTION KITES SEMINAR

The San Diego Kite Club held it's first seminar on December 15, 1990, featuring Revolution Kites, one of the many kite manufacturers located in San Diego.

The seminar was led by the brothers Joe, Jim and David Hadzicki. Joe started by explaining the basic concept behind the kite, how it began with aircraft principles integrated into a kite rather than a kite trying to perform as an aircraft. The Revolution I is the first mass-produced quadline kite. It's design allows it not only to move forward, turn left and right, but to actually stop, reverse, hover, and spin like a propeller. One of its most spectacular moves is to dive towards the ground at 50+ MPH, then come to a dead stop inches above the ground. 50-to-0 miles per hour in a fraction of a second! To my knowledge, nothing else can quite duplicate that feat.

With that theory explained at the seminar, the Hadzickis demonstrated basic flying techniques, after which they taught anyone interested on how to fly the kite and gave tips on advanced flying.

The Hadzickis followed this up by showing a sneak-peek of their latest design, simply called the "Rev II". The Rev II is about two-thirds the size of the original kite, roughly 6' for the Rev II versus 9' for the Rev I. The demand for a smaller kite began almost immediately after the original was introduced. Those requesting it were mainly flyers in high wind areas such as Hawaii or San Francisco and from flyers who didn't want a strong pulling kite. Though the market was always there, Revolution Kites waited until there were enough advanced flyers around who could fly it, the reason being that the smaller wingspan makes controlling it a lot more sensitive. Although no price has been announced, it is estimated that it will retail for approximately half of the Rev I. The Rev II will reach kite shops sometime in January of 1991.

After the informative seminar, a raffle was held, and among the items raffled off were t-shirts, posters, post cards, and limited production pins, all donated by Revolution Kites.

The San Diego Kite Club would like to thank Revolution Kites for making our first seminar a definite success, with personal thanks to Joe, Jim, David and Lolly Hadzicki.

Following Ron's seminar, the Top of the Line team will fly for the San Diego Kite Club, concluding a seminar which you won't want to miss. Ron has donated his personal time, as well as volunteered that of the team itself, in support of the S.D.K.C. A \$5.00 donation will be accepted for this program to help support club funds.

Top of the Line will additionally provide a Spinoff skin to be given away as a door prize, in addition to the club raffle following the seminar.

So, bring your family and friends, chairs, lunches, pencils and paper, to the flying field south of the Hilton on East Mission Bay Drive, January 19th, 1991, 10:00am - 4:00pm, with an informative and enjoyable day in store for all those in attendance.

Traditional Japanese Kites

On December 20th we were treated to a very informative Traditional Japanese Kite seminar that was presented by Mr. Makoto Chashi, a native of Japan, and currently a student at Portland (Gregon) Community College. The presentation was arranged on short notice by Dan Willan who had attended a meeting of the High Desert Kite Club on the previous Sunday, and had met Makoto there.

Makoto gave us a brief history of kiting in Japan, dating back to 800 BC when kites were flown by Shinto priests as a part of their religious ritual. He demonstrated and explained some of the hundreds of traditional Japanese kite designs and their sometimes subtle differences. These included the Edo, Shirone, Hata, Rokkaku and Sode kites among others.

He showed us several of the kites from his own collection, most of which he had built himself. This event was held in the community education room at Hartson's Ambulance Service offices on Chesapeake Drive in Kearny Mesa. The presentation was videotaped, so perhaps those who were unable to attend will get to see the videos. Our thanks to Makoto for presenting the seminar and to Dan Willan and his employer, Hartsons for the use of the facilities.






