Paper Bag Sled Kite

In 1956, when William M. Allison of Dayton, Ohio, patented his "Flexible Kite" with vertical spars only, it was something new in the sky. Even now, the two-stick diamond kite is still our standard mental picture of a kite. Another Ohioan, Frank Scott, saw a picture of Allison's kite in an advertisement, made some changes and added the vent, which helps to stabilize the kite. Scott called his kite a sled because it was a "Flexible Flyer," the brand name of a popular snow sled.

The sled design has proven to be extremely versatile. Sleds can be made of paper, plastic or fabric. They fly in light winds and stand up to strong winds. With lightweight materials and line, they can be small, even miniature. These characteristics make them perfect for kids. While 36 inches (vertical measurement) is not necessarily the upper limit in sleds, larger ones are not always dependable. There are Soft Sleds with vertical cells that fill with air and stiffen the kite for flight. The Paper Bag Sled, from which these plans are adapted, was developed by Dave Checkley of Seattle. Bag kites fly well in five to ten mile per hour winds.

Grocery bags and some paper shopping bags have gussets, pleats on the sides which expand when the bag is filled. The spars (bones of the kite) are made by doubling and stapling the gussets. Choose a hag that is taller than it is wide. Paper funch bags sometimes come in colors, providing an alternative to regular brown kraft paper.

Materials

Paper hag with gussets Masking or cellophane tape, 1/2" wide Bridle string Tail streamers, 1" wide and 3" to 4" long

Thols

Scissors, ruler, pencil, stapler

Instructions

- 1. Cut off the bottom of the bag. This will be a rectangular piece on grocery bag and a seam on a shopping bag.
- 2. Lay the bag flat, seam side up, gussets tucked in. Bring the long edges together and crease lightly in the middle to mark the center on front and back of the bag. Measure onethird down on the center line and draw cutting lines as shown. Cut through one layer only, discarding the shaded pieces.








- 3. Open the wings so the gussets show. Turn the hag over, folding one wing under. Double the gusset over and crease and stable near the edge, about every 2" as shown. If the gusset is wide and the folded spar 1" or more in the width, double twice before stapling. Do the same with the second gusset. You have just made the stapled spars which stiffen the kite. In flight, they are on the back (facing the sky).
- 4. Open the kite. Cut a vent as shown about one-third of the way up from the bottom of the bag. Out both sides at once by folding on the center line. The drawings show a good size relative to the size of the bag.

Measure from wing tip to wing tip and cut a piece of string three times this measurement. Tie a knot in both ends of the string and tape

5. Bring the wing tips together to find the center of the bridle. Tie a loop. The flying line ties through the loop. Tape on tails. Before you fly your sled, lay it face down and straighten the spars so they can stand up a right angles to the kite.


You can buy small reels of kite string that are suitable for bridling and flying the Paper Bag Sled. Crochet thread is a good choice for small kites because it is available, inexpensive and less prone to tangles than other lightweight cotton string. Heavy cord or twine is unsuitable: it only weighs down a small kite.

A bridle three times the width of the kite allows it to open freely. Wax the bridle string by drawing it over paraffin, beeswax, a crayon, even a bar of soap. Sleds with tan-

gled, shortened bridles By poorly.

A 4-by-6-inch piece of corrugated cardboard makes a good reel for crochet thread or other string. Wrap the string around the cardboard and tie it on before you begin winding. Fifty wraps will give you 100 feet of flying

Tails may be added for appearance, or if the kite tends to spin and dive, for stability Make tails of inch-wide strips of crepe paper. newspaper or lightweight plastic (cut from a plastic grocery bag). Remember, symmetry and precision count in kite making. Tape tails in the middle or balanced on each side of lower edge. Take scissors, tape and extra tail to the flying field to adjust for the wind of

The AKA encourages everyone to fly safely and responsibly by heeding a few simple rules:

- When flying big kites, wear gloves to protect your hands from cuts and burns by the kite line.

 Never fly a kite in wet or stormy weather.

 Never fly a kite where it may fall onto a power line. If a kite should tangle with a power line, do not attempt to free it.

 Call the local power company and report the situation.

 Do not use metal in the construction of kites.

 Never use any wire or metallic line to fly a kite. Keep your line dry.

 Do not fly from or over a street or highway.

 Avoid trees, they eat kites. If you do lose a kite to a tree, loosen the line and let the wind blow it out. Do not climb the tree.

- Do not my from or over a sacret to manage.

 Avoid trees, they eat kine, if you do lose a kite to a tree, loosen the line and let the wind blow it out. Do not cli
 Do not fly near airports.

 Avoid holes in the ground, guilies, and broken glass or other debris on the field.

 Do not allow your kite of lines to touch any bystander.

 Use extreme caution in launching and flying large kites.

 Do not fasten yourself to your kite line unless you have an efficient quick release system.

 Be particularly careful with sunt kites. Make sure your total flying area is clear, and never fly over spectators.





Individual Precision: The requirements are judged performances of 3 specified compulsory maneuvers.

Team Precision: The requirements are judged performances of 3 specified compulsory maneuvers and 2 to 5 minutes of precision freestyle. Precision teams must be comprised of 3 or more fliers from the Experienced or Open class.

Individual Ballet: The requirement is a 3 to 5 minute routine choreographed to a musical selection. Competition is held for the Experienced and Open classes.

Team Ballet - Pairs: The requirement is a 3 to 5 minute routine choreographed to a musical selection. Ballet teams are comprised of 2 fliers from the Experienced or Open classes.

Team Ballet - 3 or more: The requirement is a 3 to 5 minute routine choreographed to a musical selection. Ballet teams are comprised of 3 or more fliers from the Experienced or Open classes.

Individual Quadtine Ballet: The requirement is a 2 to 3 minute performance. This is a single class competition (no class restrictions).

Team Train Ballet: The requirement is a 3 to 5 minute routine choreographed to a musical selection. Ballet teams are comprised of 2 or more fliers. This is a single class competion (no class restrictions). Minimum of 3 kites per train.
